CLASSIC GIMLET

Q: What are the only animals that do not produce their own Vitamin C? A: Humans, guinea pigs, and fruit bats!

Who knew, right? On the brighter side, this inability to produce Vitamin C led to one of the world's greatest classic cocktails: The Gimlet.

In the late 1880's scurvy (a lethal disease caused by lack of Vitamin C) was rampant on British warships. The best preventative medicine at the time was the juice from citrus fruits. The only problem was that fruit often went bad while out at sea. Rose's Lime Cordial (the precursor to modern-day Rose's Lime Juice) had just been developed as the world's first fruit concentrate and was the citrus juice of choice on warships. However, the lime juice was a bit tough to swallow. Rear-Admiral Sir Thomas Gimlette understood the easiest way to make anything more drinkable: just add liquor! So to help out his shipmates, he added gin to Rose's Lim Cordial. Who would have ever thought one of the most timeless cocktails was born in the most unassuming of places.

Modern-day Gimlets have taken some liberties with the original recipe. The popularity of vodka in the late 20th century led to the Vodka Gimlet. And the craft cocktail craze tends to tone down the roses in favor of fresh lime juice and simple syrup. Just remember if you are ordering a true old-school Gimlet, the Rose's will drown out any subtle aromatics. Maybe save the designer gin for your Martinis!



INGREDIENTS

- 2 oz. Bombay Sapphire Gin
- 1/2 oz. Freshly Squeezed Lime Juice
- 1/2 oz. Simple Syrup

INSTRUCTIONS

Add the gin, lime juice and simple syrup to a cocktail shaker filled with ice and shake vigorously until well-chilled. Strain into a cocktail glass and garnish with a fresh lime wedge.

FALL IS IN THE AIR!

When and Where to See Peak Fall Color:

<u>Last Week in September:</u> Spotty color begins at 6,000+ feet in the highest mountains Rough Ridge and Graveyard Field on the Blue Ridge Parkway

<u>First Week in October:</u> Color transforms above 5,000 feet Mount Mitchell, Grandfather Mountain, Waterrock Knob, Black Balsam

<u>Second Week in October:</u> Best colors pick up steam at 4,000 - 5,000 feet elevation Mount Pisgah, Devil's Courthouse, Great Smoky Mountains National Park

<u>Third Week in October:</u> The ultimate week for most color at 3,000 - 4,000 feet Large portions of the Blue Ridge Parkway, Pisgah National Forest, Looking Glass Rock, Cradle of Forestry

<u>Fourth Week in October:</u> Best color shows at 2,000 - 3,000 feet elevation The city of Asheville, Biltmore, Sylva, Dupont State Forest, NC Arboretum

<u>First Week in November:</u> See lush fall colors at 1,000 - 2,000 feet elevation Hickory Nut Gorge at Chimney Rock, Lake Lure, Lake James and South Mountains State Parks east of Asheville

Blue Ridge Parkway | Rough Ridge on the Tanawha Trail | 1.2 Miles

Hike through fragile, rare mountain flora and over craggy, angular rock outcrops on the Tanawha Trail at Rough Ridge, exploring Grandfather Mountain's middle elevations. This Rough Ridge hike catches gorgeous views of the surrounding landscape, swathed in vibrant leaf color, in early autumn.



Shining Rock Mountain | via Black Balsam Knob | 10 Miles



Hike mile after rolling mile through autumn's beauty on the Art Loeb Trail, one of Western NC's most scenic trails. The trail climbs from the Blue Ridge Parkway, summiting the view-packed balds at Black Balsam Knob and Tennent Mountain, clad in golden fall grasses. Then summit the brilliant, white, quartz-crusted summit of Shining Rock Mountain, grabbing exceptional views of the autumn-hued surrounding balds.

Blue Ridge Parkway Graveyard Fields Trail | 3.3 Miles

Chase waterfalls at Graveyard Fields in the fall for a chance to catch views of these ultra-popular falls framed in stunning fall leaf color. Autumn's hues descend early in the Graveyard Fields valley - so add this hike to the early-fall bucket list.





Nantahala National Forest The Pinnacle in Sylva | 6.5 Miles

An extension of the view-studded Plott Balsam Range, this craggy stub of towering rock near Sylva, NC offers exceptional views from its summit. Hike Pinnacle Park to The Pinnacle, and soak in some sublime autumn views from its knobby summit.

Ready to hit the trail, but wondering what to pack?



- Navigation: GPS, Compass, Trail Maps
- A First Aid Kit
- Snacks & Water
- Extra Layers

- Sunscreen
- Tick & Mosquito Repellant
- Handlamp (If you're out after dark)
- All in a lightweight backpack

PUTTING EXPECTATIONS

During my time here, I have seen a pattern of members pulling up to the driving range 20-30 minutes before their tee time. They hit golf balls for most of the time and then try to sneak in a few putts before they go to the first tee. They then head out to play with the expectation of taking two or less putts on every hole.

Reality versus expectations: Below are the 2022 putting stats from the PGA Tour

1 Putt Percentages

Inside 5 Feet: 96.83% best player was 98.61% 5 - 10 Feet: 56.29% best player was 68.59% 10 - 15 Feet: 30.13% best player was 42.86% 15 - 20 Feet: 18.53% best player was 28.81%

<u>The bigger picture:</u> The percentages displayed are from the best players in the world! Maybe it's time you curb your expectations and reconsider how you warm-up/practice. Spend more time on 3-5 footers before heading out to play. If you averaged just 70% from 3-5 feet, I bet your scores would improve drastically over time. When outside of 10-15 feet, make sure you focus on your speed. It can be tough to read and aim putts on mountain greens. However, with good speed, you can misread a putt by 3 feet and still be inside the circle of high make percentage.

Challenge: Keep track of your one putt percentage when inside of 5 feet your next round.





Wondering if it still makes sense to sell your house right now? The short answer is yes. Especially if you consider how few homes there are for sale today.

You may have heard inventory is low right now, but you may not fully realize just how low or why that's a perk when you go to sell your house. This graph from Calculated Risk can help put that into perspective:

INVENTORY IS STILL HISTORICALLY LOW



As the graph shows, while the housing inventory did grow slightly week-over-week (shown in the blue bar), overall supply is still low (shown in the red bars). Compared to the same week last year, supply is down roughly 10% - and it was already considered low at the time. But, if you look further back, you'll see inventory is down even more significantly.

To gauge just how far off from normal today's inventory is, let's compare right now to 2019 (the last normal year in the market). When you compare the same week this year with the matching week in 2019, supply is about 50% lower. That means there are half the homes for sale now than there'd usually be.

The key takeaway? We're still nowhere near what's considered a balanced market. There's plenty of demand for your house because there just aren't enough homes to go around. As Lawrence Yun, Chief Economist at the National Association of Realtors (NAR), explains: "There are simply not enough homes for sale. The market can easily absorb a doubling of inventory."

So, if you want to list your house, know that there's only about half the inventory there'd usually be in a more normal year. That means your house will be in the spotlight if you sell now and you may see multiple offers and a fast home sale.
